Problems caused by pests:

- *Damage to food, supplies and facilities.
- *They can contaminate food & food contact surfaces.
- *They can spread diseases.

Pest Management Program Includes:

- *Emphasis on sanitation and exclusion of pest.
- *Training employees.
- *Use a licensed pest control operator (PCO).

Common pest problems in this region are:

1. Rodents (mice and rats)
2. Flying insects (house flies, fruit flies, drain flies, etc.)

To combat the common pests in this region, EcoLab uses:

1. Pest traps.



These are located throughout the facility.

2. Bait stations



These are located around the exterior of the premises.

3. Light traps



Light traps are located throughout the inside of the facility.

The biggest prevention:

Keeping doors closed as much as possible, good housekeeping and sanitation.



EcoLab has a pest log book. This log allows for communication to the pest control provider. If employees notice pests or pest activity, communicate this to your Department Head and/or Quality Assurance so it can be recorded into the pest log book and be addressed by EcoLab.
